Health Systems Research (HSR)

HSR is a division of health policy and social science research in the department of family and community medicine

Family Medicine Residency Program

The program began in 1972, we have graduated more than 300 family medicine doctors, most practicing in both rural and urban under-served communities.

Master of Science Degree in Medical Biotechnology

The program concentrates on biological processes, technologies and skill sets used in the research and development of pharmaceutical products, vaccines and devices for the medical industry.

National Center for Rural Health Professions (NCRHP)

This program seeks to recruit, admit and prepare medical students from the state of Illinois, who will, upon completion of residency training, locate and practice in rural Illinois as primary care physicians.

Postgraduate Fellowships for Physician Assistants

This program provides practicing PAs with advanced training in medical specialties.

Public Health Practice Certificate

The certificate is a 16 hour program of study consisting of five graduate level courses comprising the fundamental concepts essential to public health practice.

Rural Medical Education (RMED) Program

The RMED program, part of the NCRHP, is a supplement to the regular MD curriculum at the College. Ranked as one of the top rural medical education programs in the country, RMED prepares students to serve in rural areas as primary care physicians.
